

THIRD PARTY VENDOR CHECKLIST

WHAT IS A THIRD-PARTY VENDOR?

A third-party vendor is a properly licensed business that provides beverages, including alcohol, food, or a venue that a Chapter or Colony hosts an event at. These can be used at events hosted at a chapter facility as well providing a cash sale bar for those of the legal drinking age to purchase alcoholic beverages.

REQUIREMENTS OF THE VENDOR

- 1. Be properly licensed by the appropriate local and state authority. This might involve both a liquor license and temporary license to sell on the premises where the function is to be held. Request copies of the state and local licenses.
- 2. Be properly insured with a minimum of \$1,000,000 of general liability insurance, evidenced by a properly completed certificate of insurance prepared by the insurance provider. The certificate should show that the vender, as part of their coverage has "off premise liquor liability coverage and non-owned and hired auto coverage." The certificate of insurance must also name, as additional insured, your Chapter or Colony hiring the vender.
- 3. Agree, in writing, to cash sales only, collected by the vender, during the function.
- 4. Assume, in writing, all the responsibilities that any other purveyor of alcoholic beverages would assume in the normal course of business, including but not limited to:
 - a. Checking ID's upon entry
 - b. Not serving to those below the legal drinking age
 - c. Not serving individuals who appear to be intoxicated
 - d. Maintaining control of all alcoholic containers present
 - e. Collecting all remaining alcohol at the end of the event
 - f. Removing all alcohol from the premises
