  - Creighton has the packet and is working; A new issue has arisen with a
    possible risk management issue that staff is working through with the
    university
  - Arizona has the packet and is working; Waiting to reach the necessary recruitment numbers; Hop
  - Quinnipiac also on the horizon
  - o Illinois State also on the horizon
- Potential issues/challenges
  - Rowan with various issues including enrollment, academics and potential discipline issues
    - Allegations letter issues and due process has begun
    - University is potentially looking to offer a formal invitation to a group that has been operating without recognition, of which Delta Chi is one
  - o Loyola
    - Numbers are low and the group has not responded to IHQ outreach
    - One more attempt to get provisional chapter operational but group may need to be addressed
  - UNLV
- Group has expressed interest to surrender charter
- Alumni are still working to see if chapter can be saved
- IHQ is still working with this group and its alumni to see where this goes
