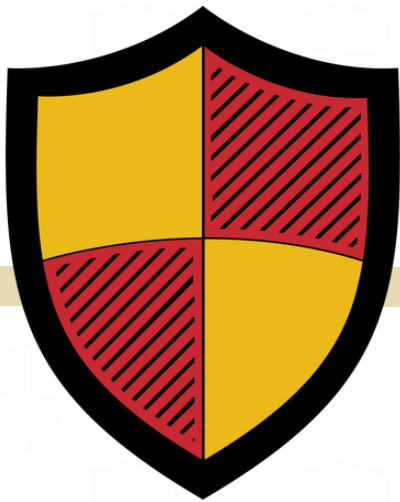

Welcome to your new role as Interfraternity Council (IFC) Delegate! You're stepping into a position that helps your chapter stay connected to the larger fraternal community. You will represent your chapter's voice at IFC meetings, share important updates, and make sure your chapter is informed and engaged. Think of yourself as a bridge between your chapter and the rest of the fraternity world on campus. This role is incredibly important to ensure your chapter stays in the know for all community happenings and is prepared to stay engaged with the university, council, and at-large student body.

RESPONSIBILITIES, RESOURCES, AND GOALS

ATTEND ALL REQUIRED MEETINGS

Show up for IFC general body meetings, committee meetings, and other related Fraternity/Sorority Life events representing your chapter. Come prepared to take detailed notes to report back to your chapter, and be well informed about updates involving your own brothers to share with the rest of the Greek community.

Stay dialed in and ready to represent Delta Chi. At some IFC meetings, you may be asked to speak on behalf of your chapter during discussions and cast votes that reflect their position. Your chapter has trusted you to take this role seriously. Don't let them down!

UNDERSTAND IFC & NIC POLICIES

BUILD CAMPUS CONNECTIONS & INVOLVEMENT

Establish relationships with IFC officers, campus advisors, and other fraternity delegates. Encourage your chapter to participate in IFC programs, service events, and campus initiatives. Utilize IHQ and NIC personnel to help with questions and overall advocacy.

PREPARE FOR A SMOOTH TRANSITION

At the end of your term, you should organize and save all materials in a shared folder, leaving helpful notes for the next delegate. You may also wish to seek office in an IFC executive board role or another leadership position on campus.
