

FROM DELTA CHI LAW:

- Each undergraduate chapter is expected to have a “BB” - Chapter Advisor, a Faculty Advisor, and an Alumni Board of Trustees to be in good standing.

WHAT DOES THAT ACTUALLY MEAN?

FACULTY ADVISOR DEFINITION:

- A Faculty Advisor should be an employee of the college/university where the chapter is located.
- They do not need to be a member of Delta Chi, and should be someone that the chapter has developed a supportive relationship with, but this should be a separate support person from the campus Fraternity/Sorority Advisor.
- There may be campus-specific student organization advisor responsibilities including serving as a Campus Security Authority, signing off on campus financial or administrative documents, or appearing on a campus-specific roster.

COMMON AREAS OF SUPPORT:

- Maintain regular contact with the officers of the chapter.
- Be knowledgeable about the values, expectations, and goals of the chapter, while helping members to understand the university's policies and guidelines.
- Be familiar and involved with activities and events of the group.
- Being available to provide resources and support for on-campus events and usage of space or on-campus financial accounts and to consult with respect to the administration of the financial affairs of the group in general.
- Typically, Faculty Advisors will often act as the Alumni Board of Trustees Scholarship Advisor. This involves offering support to the Scholarship Chair of the chapter and making connections to on-campus academic resources or advising members who may be struggling academically.
